

Multiday Outdoor Classroom on the American River

This program is based at a private scenic river camp along the South Fork of the American River and showcases the historically and ecologically rich foothills of the Sierra Nevada mountain range. The 12-acre, riverside camp is an ideal setting for a dynamic approach to outdoor education.



White Water Raft through Gold Rush History!

Students and faculty meet their guides at the campground the first day, where they will be assisted to set up provided tents, get moved in to serve dinner and later bond at an evening campfire. The next days are filled with white water rafting on different sections of the river, hiking through the foothills and learning about local ecology, natural history and gold rush history. All meals are included and each night a campfire and evening program will be offered.

Students will focus on bonding, working together as a team and getting comfortable in the outdoors, all while learning about their natural environment through hands-on experiential learning. Team building elements can be incorporated into all activities, such as navigating a raft through Class III whitewater rapids! The focus of the program will be on having fun while learning skills to enjoy these challenging but safe activities, both individually and as a group.
